

NSW Government spending \$39m




OEH expenditure: 37% of total Govt. spend

Summary of draft recommendations



Creating clear roles and responsibilities

Strengthened governance and planning



Recommendations: Accountability

- Regional cross tenure invasive species plans
- Improve accountability of government and of landholders



Address new and emerging risks

- Risks increasing
- Early detection
- State-wide response
- LLS regional rapid response



Recommendations: Coordinate collective action

- It regional pest management coordinators
- training and education for better on-ground management and understanding of the general biosecurity duty



Recommendations: Treat pests as pests

- Improve enforcement and compliance through consistent and streamlined regulation
 - Declaration of pests
 - Treat all major invasive species consistently



Recommendations: Deer

- Manage wild deer as a pest animal
- Simplify regulations surrounding recreational hunting on private land
- Engage recreational hunting groups as 1 tool among many



Recommendations: Cats

- Manage feral cats as a pest animal
- Improve responsible cat ownership
- Require owners of entire cats to be registered as breeders.
- Require all entire cats to be registered annually.

Recommendations: Smarter management

- Prioritise implementation of biocontrol for carp
- Improve wild dog management
- Reduce the impact of wild horses





Recommendations: Improved knowledge base

- Invest in Invasive Species Solutions Centre
- Undertake surveys so data current
- Adopt standardised data collection
- Continuing investment for sustained research



Recommendations: Targeted Funding

- Provide adequate resources to public land managers
- Implement IPART recommendation and reduce the rateable land area from 10 hectares to 2 hectares
- Joint funding for LLS coordinators and rapid response



The importance of implementation

 Coordination, oversight and accountability crucial
